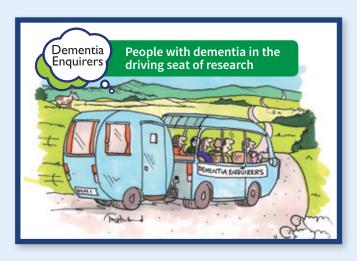

At this stage, we are inviting groups to send in an expression of interest- deadline 29th April 2019. We hope this gives your group enough time to meet to talk about the opportunity.

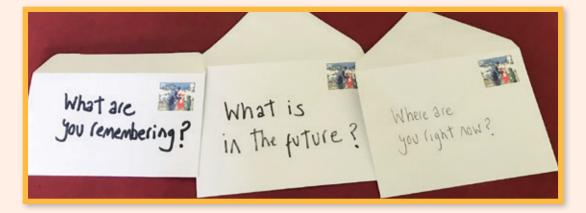


You can apply alone as one group (up to £5000) or two or more groups can apply together for up to £10,000.

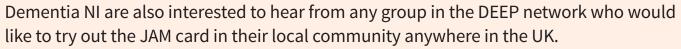
